FEDERATION COUNCIL ELECTIONS:







HCPA's Cheryl Cook (Secretary) and Sue Warne (Treasurer) have been elected and will form part of the new Federation Council for the next 4 years. The 'Howlong First' ticket achieved an outstanding result at the polls on 14 September with 20% of first preference votes (1086) across the shire falling into their hands. This allows us to commence installation of the septic system and foundations for the toilet building, however we do need to raise another \$5,000 to construct the actual building. Fencing will be upgraded, and the entrance posts repainted too. After the lengthy planning process endured by the committee over 2+ years it is very pleasing to see how close we are to fruition.
